### HPIC Veterans Memorial Update

Hubbard City Council, and the family of Marion E. Carl,( born and raised in Hubbard) has approved the Veterans Memorial to be named after the deceased Marion E. Carl. Marion was a Major General, USMC. He was a World War II fighter ace, record setting test pilot, and a notable naval aviator. He was the first Marine Corps ace in World War II and served from 1938 – 1973. Defending our country in World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War, we feel Marion is very much worthy of this honor. Many distinguished awards and victories during these wars were presented to Marion. His final resting place is in Arlington National Cemetery.

Since HPIC is not classified as a Veterans Organization, we are not eligible to apply for a grant regarding this project. We will seek donations/gifts from the public and use our own non-profit status. We are starting with the form below for those who are serious about purchasing a stone(s). **NORTH MARION CERT PROGRAM**

**THE CITY OF HUBBARD AND HUBBARD FIRE DISTRICT** are calling for volunteers to participate in the newly established **NORTH MARION CERT PROGRAM!**

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT** prepares for emergencies and disasters, however during a disaster, the number and scope of incidents can quickly overwhelm conventional emergency services. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program is an all-risk, all-hazard training. This valuable program is designed to help you protect yourself, your family, your neighbors and your neighborhood in an emergency situation. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations.

**WHEN EMERGENCIES HAPPEN**, CERT members give critical support to first responders, provide immediate assistance to victims, and organize spontaneous volunteers at a disaster site. CERT members also help with non-emergency projects that help improve the safety of the home, workplace and community.

**THE CERT PROGRAM** educates people about disaster preparedness and trains them in basic disaster response skills. CERT training teaches participants to:

- ◆ Describe the types of hazards most likely to affect their homes and communities;
- ◆ Describe the function of CERT and their roles in immediate response;
- ◆ Take steps to prepare themselves for disaster;
- ◆ Identify and reduce potential fire hazards in their homes and workplaces;
- ◆ Work as a team to apply basic fire suppression strategies, resources and safety measures to extinguish a burning liquid;
- ◆ Apply techniques for opening airways, controlling bleeding, and treating shock;
- ◆ Conduct triage under simulated conditions;
- ◆ Select and set up a treatment area;
- ◆ Employ basic treatments for various wounds;
- ◆ Identify planning and size-up requirements for potential search and rescue situations;
- ◆ Describe the most common techniques for searching structures;
- ◆ Use safe techniques for debris removal and victim extrication; and
- ◆ Describe ways to protect rescuers during search and rescue.

**AFTER BASIC TRAINING** CERT members will have opportunities to participate in disaster exercises—from tabletop to full-scale; promote emergency preparedness at community events; and respond to disasters in coordination with emergency responders in our area.

**MULTIPLE CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

Look for the following projects to begin in early April:

- ◆ 1st Street (between “A” & “D” Streets). This project consists of a complete overlay, including creative paving to eliminate the constant retention of rainwater at the “A” & 1st Street intersection. Elimination of this puddling will increase the integrity of the overlay and prevent the current large pothole from re-developing. One catch basin will also be replaced at the 1st & “C” Street intersection.
- ◆ 4th Street (between “E” & “H” Streets). This project consists of minor widening and a complete overlay.
- ◆ Barendse Park Walking Path Project. This project will widen the existing walking path by 2’ and includes a complete overlay of the entire path. Root barriers will be installed to prolong the life of the new overlay. A new 6’ concrete sidewalk will connect the 3rd Street entrance to both the walking path and the playground equipment.
