

Hubbard Police Recruiting Reserve Police Officers

The Hubbard Police Department is currently seeking individuals interested in law enforcement.

Selected individuals will attend a Reserve Academy and receive additional training upon completion. The Reserve Academy begins in September and ends in February. Currently, the Hubbard Police Department sends its Reserve Officers to the Clackamas County Inter-Agency Reserve Police Academy in Clackamas Oregon, where you will receive approximately 375 hours of police training.

Academy training occurs two weekday evenings and most Saturdays and consists of practical application and instruction in the Criminal Justice System, Motor Vehicle Law, Criminal Law and many other law enforcement related areas.

NOTE: Applicants are required to pass the POST with an 80% in each section, a police background, a psychological examination, physical exam, a drug screening and driving record check.

The primary role of a Hubbard Reserve Officer is to assist in patrol duties. Reserve Officers are also involved in community policing, bike rodeos, food drives and a bark dust sale. The Hubbard Police Reserve Organization has a total of 10 sworn officers, and is a self funded program. Each year the Hubbard Police Reserves hold a "Bark dust Sale" to help raise funds for training and equipment throughout the year.
