Established in 2012 to honor all Veterans and in memory of Marion E. Carl, born and raised in Hubbard. Hailed as a hero to the community of Hubbard, Marion served in the military from 1938 to his retirement in 1973 as a Major General in the Marines. He served during three wars and was a recipient of many awards and achievements during his military career. After his retirement, Marion died during a robbery at his home in 1998 while protecting his wife, Edna, from the intruder. He is buried at Arlington National Cemetery in Washington D.C. The Veteran's Memorial, located at Wolfer-Will Greenway at 2300 "D" Street took three years from the talking stage to completion in May, 2012, funded only by generous donations and the selling of engraved bricks.
