Step 1: Before You Start

The State of Oregon's Corporation Division provides information on which business structure is right for your business, and also handles registration.

Step 2: Name Your Business

Check the State of Oregon Business Registry database for name availability. The Oregon Business Registry assists with registering your business in Oregon.

Step 3: Select Your Location

The vlnogle [at] cityofhubbard.org (subject: Vickie%20Nogle, body: Vickie%20Nogle) (Director of Administration / City Recorder) can help with zoning questions.

Step 4: Obtain Registrations and Associated Permits

Business Registration is required for any business within the city or transact any business specified in the Hubbard Municipal Code Chapter 5.01, without registering in Hubbard. Other licenses and permits may be required, depending on your business type. (Business Registration Application)

Beginning January 1, 2024, many companies in the United States will have to report information about their beneficial owners (i.e., the individuals who ultimately own or control the company). Companies will have to report the information to the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN), a bureau of the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

On its website (BOI), FinCEN has provided guidance about the Beneficial Ownership Information (BOI) reporting requirements. There's a section that includes Small Business Resources.
