**Major General Marion E Carl, USMC**

Marion was born on the family farm near Hubbard, attended Hubbard schools and graduated from Oregon State College. Early on he became interested in aviation and learned to fly while attending college. He served in the USMC from 1939 to 1973 as a Marine aviator ace, surviving combat in three wars.

Carl is remembered by his generation as a hero of many battles, including Midway and Guadalcanal, keys to defeating Japan in World War II. His flying record included 18.5 aerial victories. After World War II, Carl became a Navy Test Pilot, setting a world speed record of 651 mph on Aug. 25, 1947. Carl also set a world altitude record of 83,235 feet and flew U-2 photo-reconnaissance missions over China. He returned to combat during the Vietnam War, commanding the 2nd Marine Air Wing. He retired in 1973 with 13,000 flying hours, a Navy Cross with two Gold Stars, the Legion of Merit with three Gold Stars, a Distinguished Flying Cross with four Gold Stars, the Air Medal with fourteen Gold Stars, the Congressional Gold Medal and several more medals.

Upon retiring from USMC, Marion returned to native Oregon where he and his wife Edna settled near Roseburg, Oregon. In 1998, at the age of 82, he was shot to death defending Edna from a home invader. Carl is buried with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery.

**Marion E Carl Veterans Memorial**

Established in 2012, the goal of the Marion E Carl Veterans Memorial is to honor all military personnel, those who have made the "ultimate sacrifice" as well as all living, deceased, and active duty veterans who have donned the uniforms of the United States Services.

The memorial displays a large granite pedestal honoring all veterans and showcases the seals of each military service. It also includes two flagpoles flying the United States, State of Oregon, and Veterans flags.

The pedestal is surrounded by 4" x 8" paving stones that may be purchased to personalize, honor and remember veterans. Engraved stones may also be purchased for family members or anyone who wishes to show support for our veterans. Notification of the location and placement of the stone will be given to each buyer or donor of paving stones.



The Marion E Carl Veterans Memorial is located within the Wolfer Will Greenway at the corner of 7th and D Streets (2300 D Street) in Hubbard, Or 97032. Handicap and visitor parking spaces are available next to the memorial. Additional parking space is available at nearby Rivenes City Park on D Street. Benches at the memorial are for resting and reflecting. The memorial is located adjacent to a main traffic arterial and rests in a park-like peaceful setting, surrounded by residential homes.
